Organized Religion

A friend of mine told me that he did not believe in organized religion. He was surprised when I said I don't believe in organized religion either.....I believe in God.

Organized religion started when some guy gathered up 12 disciples. They

weren't even the right kind of people! They were tradesmen and businessmen. One, the tax collector was even a traitor to his own people. This band of oafs were always getting it wrong and having to be corrected.

Jesus organized His religion. If you don't like organized religion, then your argument is with God. At the same time, why God entrusts the faith to very fallible humans is the mystery, but that is what He decided to do. Organized religion exists because it is the way God has chosen to transmit the faith to the world and to the next generation.

The alternative to organized religion is disorganized religion. The devil is constantly working to cull us from the flock. He works constantly to discourage us from coming together. Why? Because where 2 or 3 are gathered in Jesus' name, there He is in the midst of us. When we do not gather on Sunday morning, we cut ourselves off from Jesus Himself!

Being a part of a church allows us to participate in something bigger than ourselves. As long as we are alone, the devil can talk us into a faith no bigger than ourselves. Organized religion allows us to participate in the Body of Christ itself—what could be bigger? What is more important!

Frank Baker's Remembrances at St. John's Kittanning 200 anniversary

I've been asked to share a few words regarding growing up at St. John's. St. John's has always been, at least in my experience, a place to welcome all. A place for families to grown in their faith development and their love for each other and their God.

My faith journey started at St. Matthew's Lutheran Church in Rockville, where my parents grew up and our families lived. My Sunday school teacher at St. Matthew's Rockville, was Bob Hankey's grandmother, Agnes Hankey.

We started attending St. John's in Kittanning, when we built a room onto our home and my grandmother Tracy moved in with us. We were welcomed, immediately. As expressed in my favorite short poem by Edward Markham, "They drew a circle and shut me out. Heretic. Rebel. A thing to flout. But love and I had the wit to win. We drew a circle and took him in."

Grandma Tracy attended the lady's Bible class, which met on the stage in the auditorium in the parish house (today's Pastor's Sunday school class and the next floor down...you can still see the chips on the window sash that was opened and closed by a long pole from the floor below). This class was taught by Mrs. Lauffer, pastor's wife.

My mother, Ethel, soon taught the Von Bora Sunday school class. My dad, Carl, became an active member of the men's Bible class, taught alternately by Judge Graff, Frank Schmidt, Mr. Brocious, and others.

Brother, Richard, and I attended the J. M. Lewis boy's Bible class. Later we were members of the Sunday school class taught by H. S. Principal Forrest Schaeffer. Sister Dorothy attended Sunday School taught by Mrs. Gibson and others. Later, we were all active in Luther League, locally and in our conference. Brother and I took confirmation instruction from Dr. Lauffer. Sister Dorothy and I were confirmed by Dr. Thurau.

I suppose that some anecdotal stories about playing basketball in the basement of the parish house and coming up looking like coal miners from the dirt that had settled in the floor boards from previous floods would be interesting. Mom and Dad would ask us where we had been and we would reply, "to church." Each dribble of the ball brought a new cloud of dirt. Those were good memories. Richard and I attended, along with our dad, the annual Father and Son dinners. In those days it was always a pancake and sausage dinner. Even though the plates were larger, Bob Schall's (the water driller) pancakes hung out over the sides of the plates.

One memorable program from those dinners was given by Dr. Elmer Rice, pastor of Manorville and Rupp churches. He presented beautiful slide pictures of trees and fields and a vision for what ultimately became Lutherlyn, which we three attended many times as we deepened our faith and love of nature. (Rice Hall is named for him.) (Decades later our three children and two of our grandchildren enjoyed attending Lutherlyn, creating many new memories...canoeing from Kinzua, Horse camp, and more...and Suzy spent several summers as a cabin leader and me serving as camp grandpa)

Since days at St. John's, my brother Richard graduated seminary, served two parishes and then went on to serve in the military including Korea and Vietnam. He is now retired as a lieutenant colonel and living in Texas. I was proud of him.

Our daughter, Kathleen J. Baker, STM, is a pastor at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Harrisburg (where grandchildren Mary and Jonah serve as soloists and Jonah built an outdoor sign as his Eagle Scout project), while her husband, The Rev. Dr. Joel Petruschke serves at Holy Trinity Lutheran in Lancaster, a church that predates the American Revolution.

My mother's favorite Sunday school teacher at Rockville, Lizzie Schall, always said, unceremoniously, something I'll long remember, "self praise stinks", which is what this is starting to sound like.

I want you to know that what I have shared with you is not anything exclusive with our family, but themes that have been and are still being lived out by multitudes of families throughout our history here at St. John's, such as long-time members Dale and Jeane Smart. They knew that love was and is an action verb. With this understanding and strong belief, they became the longest serving red coat volunteers at our local hospital; built cabins at Camp Lutherlyn; Jeane sang in the "Vensel Core Quartet" and our church choir (I could spend all day talking about the faithful choir members who support our music ministry); and Jeane provided leadership by inviting Millard Fuller (Founder of Habitat for Humanity) to speak at the founding dinner of our local affiliate here at St. John's. As an aside, that organization has since completed over 30 home rehabilitations, 240 brush of kindnesses providing families with needed repairs, roofs, ramps for handicap and completed an average of two homes per year. In short, the Smarts always wisely invested their time, talent, money, and faith, living by the text in Joshua 24:15b, "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord."

At the outset, I said that St. John's is a place where Christian faith is nurtured and where families can grow and thrive. May it always be so.
