Thank God for His abundant blessings as we return a proportion of what we have first received in praise and thanksgiving for what He has first given us.





Financial Update: First Quarter

Celebration

It was reported at the Congregational Meeting on April 14 that we finished the quarter \$10,178 in the black, (offerings exceeded expenses). 9 out of 10 times in the past 10 years, we finished with a deficit, (2021 was the exception). Last year, for example, we were over \$26,000 in the hole. We normally finish March having dug ourselves a hole that is difficult to climb out of. This year we celebrate a good solid finish! *Thank you for your generosity.*

Caution

If we give our offerings like we have the past few years, we will finish April through November losing about \$5,000 per month (expenses exceeding offerings). Then, December will be a frantic catching up and begging for end of year offerings in order to break even by December 31st. That is, IF WE GIVE AS WE HAVE.

Challenge

The challenge is to stay ahead of expenses through each of us giving more to God, (in proportion to how we have been blessed). We are climbing out of a hole we have dug for ourselves these past 10 years. The good news is that God has blessed us and will continue to bless us, both as individuals and as a congregation.

In 2023 136 households gave a total of \$342,754.78 to the Mission and Ministry of St. John's. That averages \$2,520.26 per household. If each were a tither, that means each household earns on average, \$25,202.60. The Armstrong County annual household median income for 2022 (latest available) is \$61,011.00. If that average held for the members of St. John's that would mean 136 households giving a combined \$829,749.60.

The Bottom line is this: We do not give to budgets or deficits We give to God. God asks us to say "Thank You" to Him by returning a tenth of what he has first given us. And There are Two Key Principles to remember: First Fruits giving, and Proportionate giving:

First Fruits giving

means that we do not give God the leftovers. We give to God first out of our paychecks, putting God first in our financial lives.

Proportionate Giving

Means that we return a significant percentage of our income back to God in order to say "thank you" for the blessings He has first given us.

We Give to God

- To say "Thank You" for what He has first given us.
- In confidence and trust that God will continue to bless us in the future—we do not have to hold on to everything we have knowing that the Lord will provide.

Practical ways to increase giving

- Be a consistent giver.
- Take a step forward. Set a goal of becoming a tither and make a financial plan to achieve that goal. Take a step toward that goal.



The language of lament

Unlike nonbelievers, Christians can grieve with hope (see 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18). On Memorial Day and at Christian funerals and burials, our lament is real — and it's a uniquely Christian concept, according to Pastor Mark Vroegop. "It takes faith to pray when you are in pain," he writes in Dark Clouds, Deep Mercy. "Belief in God creates challenging questions, and lament provides the opportunity to reorient your hurting heart toward what is true. But in order for that to happen, you have to turn to prayer. The silent treatment must end."

Vroegop, who had a stillborn daughter, says lament opens a door that leads to trust. Heartfelt lament, he says, can be brief or messy and can feel forced or uncomfortable. But the important thing is to "keep talking to God."

"Don't allow your fear, your despair or your track record of silence to cut off the flow of grace," he urges. "Your pain can be a path toward God if you'll allow lament to be your new language."


